Your Child's Behaviour at Camp - The Camper Contract

Our fundamental behaviour policy for all campers and all staff is **COURTESY & RESPECT** - Respect for Yourself, Respect for Others and Respect for Nature. Our behaviour policy is reflected in our **Camper Contract** of important behaviour "rules" that your Child must follow and are for the **benefit and safety of all campers and staff.**

Please review this following *Camper Contract* carefully with your Child and obtain their promise that they will follow the *Camper Contract* at all time while at Camp.

THE CAMPER CONTRACT

As a camper at **Adventure Camp Challenge**, I promise to do my best to follow the rules below while at Camp. I understand and agree that if I disobey these rules, that I will be sent home.

- I will always listen to and follow the directions of the Camp Director and the all other Camp Staff at all times.
- I will be respectful of my fellow campers and all other people at Camp, as I would want them to be respectful of me.
- I will respect Nature and not cut or break or destroy trees, bushes or other plants and flowers.
- I will respect others belongings and I understand that I do not have the right to touch or move or go into somebody else's belongings or backpacks and luggage without their permission.
- I will NOT climb any trees or other objects.
- I will NOT throw rocks, sticks, or any object, EVER.
- I will NOT go into any of the Camp Staff tents or rooms.
- I will NOT go into other camper tents or rooms unless the Camp Staff give me permission to visit another Team Group's room or tent AND those campers have invited me to come into their tent or room.

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- I will NOT go into the Camp trailers or the Camp Van and I will stay away from the Camp kitchen, office and all cooking and storage areas.
- I will NOT verbally abuse or bully, punch, push or pull any other camper or Camp Staff, EVER.
- I will stay with in the Camp boundaries AT ALL TIMES.
- I will follow Camp Appropriate Behaviour at all times and not use vulgar or inappropriate language while I am at Camp.

If your Child does not keep their *Camper Contact* and is your Child is not listening to our Camp staff and their behaviour not manageable this causes a safety concern creating a risk for themselves and/or their fellow campers and/or the Camp staff. In this case we will call you to come and pick-up and take your Child home.

- The parent or guardian of a Nova Scotia Child must come across the PEI ferry to the Wood Islands PEI ferry terminal. Click here for a Google Map. Parents & Guardians can park their car at the side parking lot, at the Caribou Nova Scotia ferry terminal, and simply walk on the ferry for no cost. Then our Camp staff will meet you at the gangway where you walk off the ferry, with your child and their luggage. Then you can simply walk right back on the ferry go back to Caribou to pick up your car. OR the parent or guardian can alternatively come to the New Brusnwick Cape Jourimain Nature Centre and Tourist Centre at the beginning of the Link bridge to PEI. Click here for a Google map. We will bring your child over the bridge and meet you there.
- The parent or guardian of a PEI child must come directly to the Camp to pick up their Child.
